

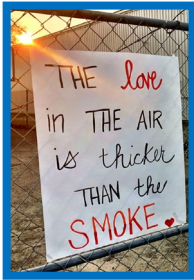

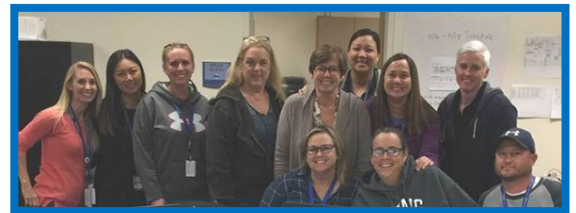

Santa Clara County Public Health Team Deploys to Butte County

Members of the County's Public Health Department (PHD)—Rhoda Blankenship, Rick Filippuzzi, Rebecca Quenelle, Caitlin Stewart, and Lisa Loel—deployed to the Butte County Public Health Department during the Camp Fire. They provided critical support to the Department Operations Center (DOC) and a shelter clinic in Oroville.

In the DOC, Rhoda Blankenship served as Operations Section Chief and Rick Filippuzzi as the Planning Section Chief. They identified unmet needs, coordinated shelter operations for logistics and medical personnel. Rick led the daily action planning process and developed planning tools and templates for use by Butte County after the Santa Clara County team's departure and for future events. Participating Federal and State partners include leadership from the California Department of Public Health, California Governor's Office of Emergency Services, and California Emergency Medical Services Authority.

The Santa Clara County PHD nursing team included Rebecca Quenelle, Caitlin Stewart, and Lisa Loel. They served patients both inside and outside of the shelter, providing care for chronic and acute conditions and coordinating medications and patient transfers to area hospitals. The team worked side by side with members of the Butte County Public Health Department staff, many of whom were impacted by the Camp Fire. The County of Santa Clara Public Health Department staff are very grateful for the opportunity to provide their services and skills to the Camp Fire disaster survivors in their time of need.

Three teams from the Santa Clara County Operational Area deployed to Butte County in the last several weeks. This article is the first in a series that will discuss the deployments and lessons learned from this major disaster.

National Weather Service San Francisco Bay Area

929 AM PST Wed Dec 12, 2018 - SYNOPSIS...Dry conditions are forecast to continue across our region through Thursday night. Daytime temperatures will be mild while nights will be seasonably cool. Patchy fog could redevelop tonight across the area, especially in the valleys. A weak weather system will likely produce light rain on Friday and Friday night, especially for areas north of the Golden Gate. Periods of light rain may continue into Saturday and Saturday night, mainly in the North Bay. A stronger and wetter system is then expected to produce widespread rain across our entire region Sunday and Sunday night. Dry weather will likely return by late Monday.
